
Little Ouse Headwaters Project (LOHP) Newsflash!

New land for the LOHP

We are delighted to be able to tell you that as of today, the LOHP is the proud owner of two new pieces of land in Thelnetham. The two sites are adjacent to each other, located on the south bank of the Little Ouse, running east from the ford on the Thelnetham/Blo' Norton road. As is now traditional, we are naming the sites after their former owners - Parker's Piece and Bleyswyck's Bank. This purchase is an important step towards achieving our aim of a continuous corridor of land along the river managed for wildlife, giving us another 5.3 Ha of land with nearly half a kilometer of river front. It also means we will be able to create more footpaths, extending public access to a new part of the valley.

With the invaluable help of Sarah Grieveson, our River Link Appeal Director, we have been very busy over the last few weeks raising funds for both the purchase costs and a major, 2-3 year restoration project. The restoration will hopefully see this neglected area returned to species-rich fen vegetation over the next few years. We have been very successful so far - all the purchase costs have been raised together with a substantial sum towards the restoration, with many applications still under consideration. The purchase has been made possible with the help of generous grants from the Tubney Charitable Trust, St Edmundsbury Borough Council and the Garfield Weston Foundation.

We will bring you more details of the sites and our plans for them once we have had time to draw breath but, in the meantime, we will be exploring the new sites and holding a celebration at our next scheduled work party on Sunday (14th October) -please come and join us; we promise it will be more party than work this time!
